A CELEBRATION OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH

To celebrate and recognize Black History Month at Calvary Church, we will feature on the cover of the Sunday Bulletin artworks by Henry Ossawa Tanner.

Henry Ossawa Tanner (June 21, 1859 – May 25, 1937) was an American artist and is considered the first African American artist to gain international recognition for his works. Born in Pittsburgh to the Rev. Benjamin Tucker Tanner and Sarah Miller Tanner. Following his graduation from Allegheny Institute (later renamed Avery College) and the Western Theological Seminary, both in Allegheny City, Benjamin T. Tanner became a clergyman and later Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church and relocated his family to Washington DC and Philadelphia, where he served several congregations and became the editor of many



of the AME denominations periodicals. Henry's parents gave him the middle name Ossawa to commemorate the battle between anti- and pro- slavery settlers in Osawatomie, Kansas in 1856.

While in Philadelphia, a young Henry developed an interest in art and was admitted to the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and become a student of Thomas Eakins. In 1891, he moved in Paris, France where he spent most of his career as an artist, and his works were accepted for exhibition at the Académie des Beaux-Arts, for which he gained much acclaim. His artworks often depict Biblical scenes, landscapes, everyday life of African Americans, and later streetscapes of the Holy Lands. Because of racism, Henry O. Tanner maintained his residence in Paris the remainder of his life, but often returned to United States of short periods of time.

Today, Tanner's artwork can be viewed in art museums throughout the world. In 1972, the United States Postal Service commemorated Tanner's legacy with a postage stamp. During the administration of President Bill Clinton, the White House purchased Sand Dunes at Sunset, Atlantic City (c. 1885), the first painting in the art collection of the executive mansion by an African American artist, which hangs in the Green Room.

The story of this American hero, Paul Robeson, who struggled and triumphed comes alive in a rousing 90-minute song-filled presentation performed by the gifted Pittsburgh native, gifted American baritone and international ambassador of peace, Anthony Brown. "I Go On Singing" brings music and history alive with equal parts documentary and live concert experience. Musical numbers range from spirituals to Broadway, and include Robeson's original arrangements of favorites like "Wade in the Water," "Ol' Man River," "It Ain't Necessarily So," "Water Boy" and many others. In addition, Robeson's musical colleague, the legendary folk singer Pere Seeger, makes three video appearances discussing his friendship with Robeson, the music they shared, and the turbulent times in which they lived. "Once in a lifetime a human being comes along who stands head and shoulders above the rest. Paul Robeson was such a man." A free-will offering will be received at the evening's conclusion to help cover the cost of the program.






Spark Story Bible — Sunday School Edition
