

A CELEBRATION OF BLACK HISTORY MONTH

To celebrate and recognize Black History Month at Calvary Church, we will feature on the cover of the Sunday Bulletin portraits of African-American Hymn Writers.

Margaret Allison Bonds (1913 - 1972) born in Chicago, Bonds father was an activist in the Civil Rights movement and her mother a church musician and a member of the influential National Association of Negro Musicians. She studied music at Northwestern University (Methodist related) where she was admitted at the young age of sixteen. There, she earned a Bachelor's in Music (1933) and a Master's in Music (1934). Relocating from Chicago in 1939 to New York City, Bonds married Lawrence Richardson, and became a close friend of



Langston Hughes. As a pianist, music arranger, and teacher she would collaborate with Hughes to bring his poetry and other works into music. In 1964, Bonds wrote Montgomery Variations for orchestra, a set of seven programmatic variations on the spiritual "I Want Jesus to Walk with Me." The work is centered on Southern Blacks' decision no longer to accept the segregationist policies of the Jim Crow South, focusing on the Montgomery Bus Boycotts and the 1963 bombing of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church in Birmingham. Ultimately, the work was dedicated to Martin Luther King Jr. Perhaps the best-known work of Bonds is her arrangement of He's Got the Whole World in His Hands.
